

Did you know?

- The Stone Age began 2.5 million years ago.
- The Stone Age happened across all continents so all ethnicities and cultures have similar Stone Age histories.
- Women and children are often overlooked in Stone Age artefacts and sources but evidence suggests everyone would have been involved in hunting and gathering to survive.
- During the Stone Age, mainly Stone or wooden equipment was used. As the Bronze Age began, people began to make Bronze weapons which meant hunters were able to kill bigger animals more easily.

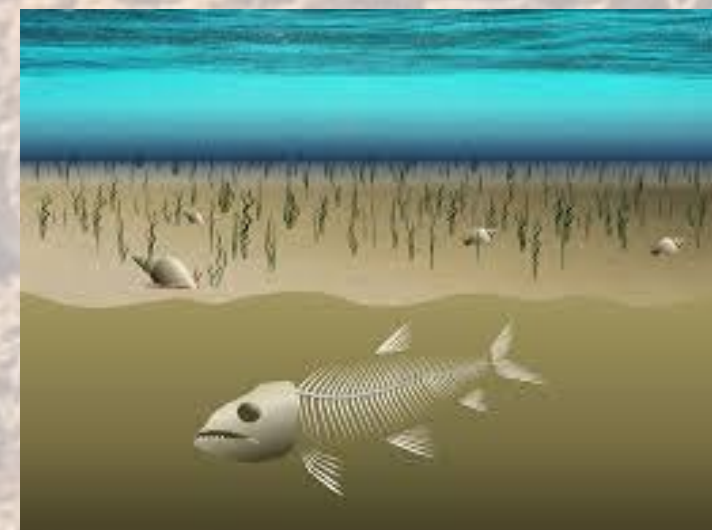


Fossils Rock

Palaeolithic to Neolithic

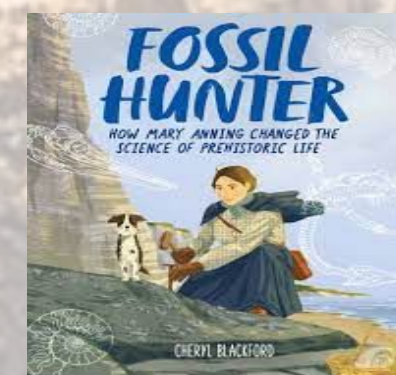
How are fossils formed?

- An animal dies and is buried in sediment.
- Extreme pressure turns the sediment into stone.
- The skeleton dissolves and leaves a hole or a mould.
- Water seeps in and minerals from this crystallise and form a cast of the skeleton.
- Millions of years later, the fossil is exposed to the Earth's surface.
